The second step, "Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity," is written in the past tense, as all the Steps, because they state what happened for us when we practiced the program. For some of us a Higher Power has been the only source of love and solace in a long, painful journey. Others of us have prayed for so long without result that we are bitter and suspicious. There are also those among us who have never thought much about whether a God exists, and others still who have experienced abuse and alcoholism within organized religion. Though many members choose to call their Higher Power, God,

some members find a Power greater than themselves in the natural world or in the deep caring of their group.

Tradition 2 - For our group purpose there is but one authority – a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

Our enduring strength may lie in the fact that we are a fellowship of equals. No one member, regardless of education, political clout, or professional expertise, is any more valuable to the fellowship than any other member. We are all experts because of our experience, and we are all beginners because our lives are in a constant state of growth and change. Newcomers are as likely as longtime members to utter words that inspire and inform. So we have no reason to look to any one person or small group of people as authorities.
