The Fourth Step helped change my life. At first I did a lot of analyzing and that didn't work. Aiming for perfection wasn't the way to go either. So I kept it simple. I looked at the good side first and then worked on one thing at a time on the bad side. It made me realize that I have a lot of good qualities that I've missed because I've been spending a lot of time concentrating on my faults.

Tradition Four – Each group should be autonomous, excepting in matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole.

THE AUTONOMY described in Tradition Four allows each group to decide what works best for its members within Al-Anon guidelines and principles. Without such autonomy at the group level, every meeting would be exactly the same. Autonomy makes responses to our members' need possible and gives us room to make mistakes and to learn from correcting them. The Worldwide fellowship of Al-Anon is richly nourished by the experience of the various groups, as they are shared with the larger whole through district and area meetings and the World Service Conference (WSO). However, the Tradition cautions us to be sure that decisions made by our group do not affect another group adversely or present an unfavorable or inaccurate picture of Al-Anon and AA as a whole.

Concept Four – Participation is the Key to Harmony.

At the 2009 World Service Conference, we were asked to consider how our Legacies could be used either as barriers that keep us apart or as bridges that bring us together. I find it very interesting how I can change the most spiritual of ideas into weapons. Take Concept Four for example. "Participation is the key to harmony" is very sound in its simplicity. And yet I could take that to mean: You had better participate in what we are doing, how we are doing it, where we are doing it, and we are doing it – or you are not doing your part for your own recovery.

After all, that's how it was in my family. It wasn't until I was serving on the TEAM task force (the new service event with Area and WSO participation), that I saw the other side of this Concept. For years I had been hearing from all the "service junkies" how the Regional Service Seminar was the place to be – no matter where it was. So what that I lived in San Jose, CA and the RSS was in Anchorage, Alaska? How important is my recovery? And when I would hear about these small remote districts and Areas that didn't participate in any Rsss... well, where are their priorities? If they wanted harmony they should be participating. Together we can open the door to participation. All it takes is a willingness to accept that sometimes my part of Concept Four is to help make participation possible. My recovery is so much fuller when I reach to the Legacies to find a bridge.
