Al-Anon's Three Legacies - November

Step Eleven – Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us, and the power to carry that out.

Improving my conscious contact with God, to me means developing a spiritual practice that brings an awareness of God in my life. I take time to listen in the stillness daily, and I pray fervently aloud, not making requests for what I want, because I don't know what's best, but only for knowledge of God's will. One of the best ways for me to work Step Eleven is to go to an Al-Anon meeting, where God with Skin speaks to me through you.

Tradition Eleven – Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, films, and TV. We need guard with special care the anonymity of all AA members.

When I started to attend Al-Anon Meetings, I became enthusiastic about the program, because I wasn't alone anymore. So, I started to tell everyone about this great program, how it helped me and how it could help everyone I came in contact with. I didn't know it at the time, but that was promotion, not attraction. As I kept coming around I realized the importance of personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, films and TV. An example was when the World Service Office was moving to Virginia Beach, VA and we saw an interview of Ric B., Al-Anon's Director, discussing the move with a reporter on the television. His back was to the camera and he was introduced as Ric B. As an Al-Anon member, I knew who he was because of having met him, but to the outside world he was an anonymous member of Al-Anon keeping his personal anonymity while on TV. Being a member of Al-Anon. I can determine at what level I want to maintain my personal anonymity at home, but I need to be careful not to break my anonymity at the public level. Because Alcoholic Anonymous is an anonymous program also, we must guard the anonymity of A.A. members at all times.



Concept Eleven – The World Service Office is composed of selected committees, executives, and staff members.

The World Service Office is comprised of 12 committees—Archives, Alateen, Budget, Conference, Cooperating with the Professional Community, Institutions, International Coordination, Literature, Nominating, Policy, Public Information, and Regional Service Seminars. Each one has an important function in Al-Anon, and each one is comprised of members with expertise in those specific areas.

So what if the Alateen Committee started getting involved in budget issues, or the Literature Committee decided to address a conference matter? I would think the concerns of Alateen and Literature wouldn't be attended to, and the budget and conference would be a mess.

That has been one of the biggest lessons I have learned in Al-Anon. My life was in disarray because I was always focused on the actions of everyone else. I never realized my constant attempts at controlling the people and circumstances around me were keeping me from having control in my own life.

Today I do my best to stay in my own lane. It has helped me tremendously as it releases me to take care of myself, the one person in life I do have control over.
