Step 11

Tradition 11

Concept 11

Al-Anon is not allied with any sect, denomination, political entity, organization, or institution; does not engage in any controversy; neither endorses nor opposes any cause. There are no dues for membership. Al-Anon is self-supporting through its own voluntary contributions.

Al-Anon has but one purpose: to help families of alcoholics. We do this by practicing the Twelve Steps, by welcoming and giving comfort to families of alcoholics, and by giving understanding and encouragement to the alcoholic.

Step Eleven and Aligning My Will

I used to suffer long and hard, in pain and misery, trying to force solutions. I didn't have time to pray or meditate because I was too busy trying to fix the problem! Thanks to what I've learned in Al-Anon, things are better. Now, when I find myself jammed up due to my alcoholic loved one, or to any number of things that are not cooperating with my plan, I more readily take my concerns to God.

Yet, my prayers still begin with lame attempts at directing the show. I do this by giving direction to God. This reminds me of a really bad back seat driver—one who can't see the road ahead, or what lurks around blind corners, yet still feels the need to call out directions: "Turn right, turn left, stop, go, etc."

But God *does* know the road before me. And only He knows that to get me to point C, I must first go through points A and B. There's no other way to get there. Although the road may be rough, heartbreaking, and downright frightening at times, its purpose is to bring me to where I need to be. He knows what's best for me. When I pray according to *my* will, I am assuming that *I* know what's best. Not only for me, but for everyone else! This self inflicted responsibility comes with a lot of pressure. "I need to get this right!"

I have to remember that I have a very limited perspective. How can I possibly know what's best when all I can see is what's right in front of me? (And even that is subject to interpretation.) I forget that being the Master of the Universe is a huge responsibility for one as small as me. Since I don't know the future, or the plan to get there, I can't know what is best for the here and now. But God does.

It's through prayer and meditation that I align my will with God's. In meditation I sit quietly and focus on my breath. This helps clear my head of its chatter, and makes me more accepting of what is. I soon feel closer to my HP. How close can you feel to someone with whom you spend no time?

Towards the end of my prayer, I find myself praying only for God's will. What started out as panicked requests usually ends with praise and a deeper awareness of a bigger God with a bigger plan. My world is more manageable because I now realize that I'm **not** managing it. God is. And now I have peace.

Reflecting on Concept Eleven

The Twelve Concepts of Service summarize the Al-Anon principles that have proven to help Al-Anon's service organizations function effectively together. The 12 concepts are the way the business end of Al-Anon is run. This month we focus on Concept 11: The World Service Office is composed of selected committees, executives, and staff members.

There are 12 committees which make recommendations to guide Al-Anon's WSO. These committees are: Alateen, Archives, Budget, the Conference Committee, World Service Conference, Cooperating with the Professional Community, Institutions, International Coordination, Literature, the Nominating Committee, Public Information, and the Regional Committee.

Everything World Service does, it assigns to a Committee. That's probably where the idea that no one does anything alone in Al-Anon originated. There is no one person in charge in Al-Anon, and the members of each committee change regularly.

This use of committees is replicated at the state level, in AISDV, in the district, and finally, in our beloved home groups. We volunteer for positions and step down when our term is up. We have the common goal to keep Al-Anon healthy and strong, and we do this by allowing others to step up to service.

In addition to its committees, the WSO also seeks good leaders who manage it as executives. People are chosen who practice the Al-Anon principles in all their affairs and stay abreast of what is happening in the Al-Anon community.

Lastly, Al-Anon has paid employees in addition to its volunteers. Using the principle of being totally self-supporting, Al-Anon pays its employees a fair wage for the type of work they do. This is the way employees are shown respect as they perform their duties. In Al-Anon, we practice honesty, fairness, respect, and willingness. We keep our principles uppermost in our minds, which help to guarantee continued friendly, efficient service within Al-Anon and in our lives.

Concept 11 can also be brought into our family life. My own personal experience was to have family meetings, allowing our children to say what they agreed with and what they did not in the way we ran our home. We all had chores. I learned that I didn't have to do everything myself. We also had allowances for our children, which I believed helped them to have a concept of the value of money and responsibility. For my own accountability, I gave myself challenges for which I set deadlines. I was relieved to see that I accomplished a lot of them.

At first glance, the Concepts seem like they do not relate to us, but neither did the Traditions until we applied them in our meetings and our home lives. One day at a time, I, too, have learned to practice these principles in all my affairs.

Practicing Tradition Eleven

While the Twelve Steps relate to the personal growth of individual Al-Anon members, the Twelve Traditions relate to unifying the Al-Anon groups by adherence to these Traditions by all groups. This month, we examine Tradition Eleven.

Tradition Eleven: Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, TV, and films. We need guard with special care the anonymity of all AA members.

We know from sad experience how well it works when we try to control things. Yet, when we reap the benefits of living both the Al-Anon program and practicing the Twelve Steps, we may be tempted to promote Al-Anon to others by shouting from the rooftops, figuratively speaking, thus changing/controlling the lives of others. There is a fine line here because we do want others to know about the help and healing we have experienced in Al-Anon. However, Tradition Eleven warns us to maintain personal anonymity. Rather than promote Al-Anon, we must step back, and with humility, by example, attract others to want what we have and to, then, seek it in our program.

As far as press, radio, TV, and films are concerned, these media may be used, but only if anonymity is maintained. This is why we will never see a celebrity promoting Al-Anon or AA. In Al-Anon, in Tradition Eleven, we are also charged with protecting the anonymity of AA members as these may be our own loved ones, the family members or friends who brought us to Al-Anon in the first place.

We have a Public Outreach program which is not a contradiction of Tradition Eleven because it does not violate anyone's anonymity, but rather, it makes the message of Al-Anon available to people who might otherwise not hear it. So, pamphlets in doctor's offices and other means of informing and attracting people to the help they may desperately need are valuable tools we use in Al-Anon. My mother lived in an alcoholic marriage, and she suffered unspeakably. She never heard of Al-Anon. Thus, the Public Outreach program has the purpose and intent of reaching people who are suffering and need the help and peace that we have found. Reaching out to those in need *in a spirit of humility* is what Tradition Eleven is about.
