Tradition 12

Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles above personalities.

General Warrantees of the Conference (taken from Concept 12)

1. That only sufficient operating funds, including an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle 2. That no Conference member shall be placed in ungualified authority over other members 3. That all decisions be reached by discussion vote and whenever possible by unanimity 4. That no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy. 5. That though the Conference serves Al-Anon, it shall never perform any act of government, and that like the fellowship of Al-Anon Family Groups which it serves, it shall always remain democratic in thought and action.

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My Spiritual Awakening

Step 12: Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to others, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

Realizing, in Al-Anon, that there really is a God (or Higher Power) and that she wants the best for me—and all people—has been my spiritual awakening. I came to Al-Anon so beat down by alcoholism, I was pretty sure there was no God. If there was, she certainly didn't care about me. By slowly opening my mind and listening to others share, I began to hope for something different—a new way to live.

When I learned that focusing on myself and gratitude could transform my life, I realized I should give God and Spirituality some effort as well. What did I have to lose? I took what I liked and left the rest. I heard someone say they didn't need to figure out everything about God, but they knew their God was very big and that was enough. That worked for me too.

I tried asking God for help before I did something scary, and things seemed to go much easier when I did. I tried to slow down and enjoy the beautiful moments of my life, and I tried getting through the tough times with a knowledge that the strength of my HP was sustaining me. Once I did, I was no longer alone in this "cruel world." I could change my attitude and, therefore, my life, with the help of my HP.

Today, I believe my HP led me to Al-Anon to teach me how to be a happier person. I'm learning that the best way to carry the message of Al-Anon is by changing myself. I try not to be the boss at home—realizing that sometimes others have good ideas too (ha ha). Instead of constantly thinking about how others should change or how they could solve their problems, I try to remember that I don't know what's best. I try to believe and express the belief that they'll figure it out. My job is to focus on my own problems.

My letting go of control helps my family members be less rigid and controlling, too. It's like I put down my end of the rope in a tug of war. My husband and I can now listen to each other's ideas and compromise to come up with an even better way. In my humble opinion, my whole extended family could benefit from Al-Anon, but it's not my job to corral them into this wonderful program. I can pray for them to find their own way to peace and serenity and then let it go.

This step urges us to practice these principles in all our affairs—principles such as compassion and acceptance of others. I can see that this part of Step 12 will take me a very long time. I work in an office with someone who clears his throat and gags throughout the day. When he has a cold, he coughs about every six minutes. He never tries to do any of this quietly. These noises drive me insane if I allow them to. And therein lies the secret—if I allow them to. I have no control over what he does. However, I do have control over how I process it.

I can try to remember that he is child of God, just like me. I can try to remember that he probably has no idea of how disgusting it sounds to clear your throat with your mouth open, or how annoying it is when someone beats their eggs with a fork for 90 seconds and then microwaves them—stinking up the whole office. (As you can see, I still struggle with this.) But me letting my co-worker just be who he is helps me. I can be humbled by remembering that I am not perfect either, and I don't know the perfect/right way to do everything. Since I don't want to be the person who thinks they are perfect, I have to be the one willing to change. To be humble, patient and tolerant, **I** have to change. That's why, after all this time, I keep coming back!
