Step Two

Working Step 2

Came to believe that a power greater than myself could restore me to sanity.

Coming into Al-Anon and hearing this step read over and over again was eye opening. I knew God, but I only knew him as a punisher. He was not only greater than me—I feared his wrath. So telling me he could restore me to sanity didn't help at first. Instead, it angered me. I was not insane! I believed the lie that I told myself—everything was fine. If my qualifier would just listen to me, and allow me to shape our lives, everything would be just great.

Believing that lie that I told myself, and others like it, was the beginning of my insane thinking. I believed that he was Prince Charming, and I was Cinderella. Yet, both were not true. It took many twenty-four hours and a lot of step work to get me to see who the problem was. ME! I needed a power greater than myself, and I needed that power to restore my thinking back to center.

You see, I am worthy of God's love and care, but I had to surrender my need to control everything first. Once, I stopped with all the scenarios of what I thought life should be, it left room for my higher power to show up and teach me about me, and Him. To teach me how to sanely relate to his other children. And to teach me how to receive, give and appreciate love.

For our group purpose there is but one authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants—they do not govern.

When I accepted my first service position of Group Representative, I was still very new to the fellowship, and still living in an alcoholic home. I approached the position just like I approached everything with my qualifiers. I was in charge, because I knew best. It was no surprise that I was quickly unhappy and dissatisfied with this new role. I couldn't understand, when I brought ideas to the group, why they didn't just accept them with open arms. I had countless discussions with my sponsor about what I thought was wrong with the group, and why they should be able to see that my way was the best way. I mean, "They gave me this position! Surely, that meant they wanted me to be in charge and run the show." I wanted her to agree with me about how messed up THEY were, but all she ever said was, "What part did you play?"

Thankfully, I was working the steps, but, in spite of that, I still couldn't find a solution to my problem. Then, I stumbled upon Tradition 2. It said, "For our group purpose, there is but one authority—a loving God" ...not me and my know-it-all self! "...Our leaders are but trusted servants—they do not govern." Wait, you mean, I was not in this position to govern the group?! What a shocker that was.

When I was able to digest that, and get honest with myself, I started to understand that the real problem wasn't the group—it was me, and my need for control. I was able to understand, and most importantly, accept, that I was just a trusted servant—I did not govern! When I began to accept and apply Tradition 2 to my position, I could actually enjoy service. I did not have to approach the group as I had approached the alcoholic—as someone to control or govern, because I felt that they were incapable of governing themselves. As a result, my relationship with my group improved. Things were less stressful for me, because I no longer believed that I was responsible for the entire group. That responsibility rightfully belonged, and still belongs, to our Higher Power as He expresses Himself through our group conscience.

Al-Anon has given me so many valuable lessons, and service has helped me grow in ways I never even knew I needed. For that, I'll be forever thankful.
