#### LITERATURE COORDINATOR CORNER

Two wonderful Alateen books are <u>Alateen, Hope For Children of Alcoholics</u> (B-3) and <u>Courage To Be</u> Me, Living With Alcoholism (B-23).

The smaller of the two, <u>Alateen, Hope For Children of Alcoholics</u>, is not light in content. Even the cover of that little book is amazing. The bright yellow cover has an abstract eye with a tear, and the word Hope contains a smiley sun. Anyone questioning whether Alateen could help them will find answers in this book. The Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions are listed and described. Personal stories written by Alateen members are moving and enlightening. There is information on how to find or start and organize an Alateen meeting. I learned there is the Lone Member Service intended for young people who feel they could benefit from Alateen but can't attend meetings. Page 89 states that someone interested in the Lone Member Service can email <a href="wso@alanon.org">wso@alanon.org</a>. They will be put in contact with an Alateen member who attends meetings regularly and will begin correspondence. Both parties benefit from this arrangement. This book is available in English (B-3) and Spanish (SB-3).

<u>Courage To Be Me, Living With Alcoholism</u> also contains information about the Steps and Traditions, with the added bonus of worksheets. There are also worksheets on general topics, such as Working on Solutions on page 299. More stories written by Alateen members, as well as poetry and fun and serious illustrations are found throughout the book.

Both of these books are written in plain and easy to read language. So much love and care were put into the creation of these books that my inner teen benefitted greatly from reading them. They would make a great gift for your favorite teen, no matter what their situation is.

DRs from all over Pennsylvania work together to plan the annual PA Area Assembly.

- It was okay that my *RAP* format/design didn't look like previous *RAP*s. I did what I could based on my few skills, imagination, and interest; and that was enough to keep things going. As time went on, the *RAP* issues got a bit better (like my recovery).
- Consistency and timeliness were attributes that gave me a safe/easy structure to work within.
- Last but not least, I learned more about Al-Anon and its twin messages of hope and love.

# The Al-Anon Family groups have no opinion on outside issues; hence our name ought never be drawn into public controversy.

The Traditions are guides for our groups' growth and show us unity. By practicing them whole-heartedly, we can learn how to love and accept ourselves and others — within our meetings and families.

"While many of us discover for the first time that we actually have opinions of our own, we also realize that everyone else has just as much right to their opinions as we do ours." (How Al-Anon Works for Families & Friends of Alcoholics, p. 119)

As we gain clarity in our minds, we discover what our opinions are and stay focused on our own attitudes, we will be free of giving unwanted advice to family and friends. As we learn not to be distracted by others, it becomes easier to be non-judgmental. With time and prayer, this helps me evolve into what God's will is for me.

The second part of Tradition Ten refers to how a conflict becomes a controversy when one does not stay in his or her own lane.

In moments when I need to spiritually detach from another human, it is vital for me to seek Higher Power (HP). The Serenity Prayer and slogans such as Let Go and Let God, are go to's for me to center myself and intertwine my heart with HP.
