## <u>REFLECTIONS ON THE LEGACIES OF AL-ANON</u>

Recovery through the Twelve Steps, Unity through the Twelve Traditions, Service through the Twelve Concepts of Service

<u>Step 12</u>: Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to others, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

I believe a "spiritual awakening" can happen during the first Alanon meeting we attend. When we listen to others share, read literature and talk to a sponsor, eventually we "wake up" and learn alcoholism is a disease that affects everyone in the family. During the first year of attending this program, I had a "gentle metamorphosis" of the way I saw self and others. Even though my circumstances did not change until a decade later, I had a new perception on life. Today, I know it's my behavior and attitude that needs tweaking, in order to "carry this message out to others."

<u>Tradition 12</u>: Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles above personalities.

Spiritual foundation is a form of connectedness - often without knowing how or why we are connected - we are. Spirituality exists in the present moment while also having a sense of timelessness about it. Spirituality can be accessed in any of the senses. It exists regardless of language, culture, age, background. It does not need a name. It is often anonymous.

In Al-Anon I find strength in being present and showing up for myself and in service to the group. In tapping into my anonymity or if you will, my connectedness to the whole, I more easily connect to my Higher Power. Anonymity provides safety and respect to everyone while also reminding us we are all part of a greater spiritual connectedness. We are all equal and each has a Higher Power greater than ourselves.

Tradition 12 reminds - it isn't about the name or the personality, it is about the message being delivered or the work or action which needs to be accomplished. It reminds me to ask myself if I am choosing an action or following thinking to fit into the ideal of an individual personality or being open-minded and keeping the principle, the greater purpose, above any personality.

<u>Concept 12</u>: The spiritual foundation for Al-Anon's world services is contained in the General Warranties of the Conference, Article 12 of the Charter.

Though I've been in Al-Anon many years, I've only recently started to study the Concepts and think about how to apply them in the fellowship and in my life. When I read the word "Warranties" in Concept Twelve, it calls to mind the product warranties I receive when buying a new product. Those warranties explain the proper use of the product and what I can expect from the product when I follow those guidelines. In a similar way, the General Warranties of the Conference provide the spiritual foundation for how we as Al-Anon members and groups can work together most effectively in support of our worldwide fellowship of recovery.

I like that Concept Twelve states, "In all proceedings the World Service Conference of AlAnon shall observe the spirit of the Traditions." It helps me remember that even though the Concepts may seem technical, I can always find a personal spiritual connection to them through my understanding of the Traditions. Here's how I see the Traditions woven into the General Warranties: Warranty One and Tradition Seven, Warranty Two and Tradition Two, Warranty Three and Tradition One, Warranty Four and Tradition Ten, and Warranty Five with Traditions Five and One. I'm a grateful member of Al-Anon because in this fellowship I'm learning how to live more fully in the world and contribute to a group in a healthy and accountable way. Thank you, Al-Anon, for helping me build relationship skills I never imagined would be possible for me.

I learned how to be kind and compassionate to myself.

The kindness and compassion in the support of Al-Anon continues to help reinforce my self-kindness and self-compassion. I, in turn find peace, sanity, and gratitude for my life. From here, I want to give back to others some of the kindness and compassion that I was so generously and unconditionally given.
