#### LITERATURE COORDINATOR CORNER

There is so much fabulous CAL (Conference Approved Literature). I have a habit of acquiring books, CAL and otherwise, and leaving them for someday. I'm learning that someday is today.

Acting as AISDV Literature Coordinator has provided me with the opportunity to read, reflect and share what I have read. Service truly is a gift.

The CAL I will talk about today is <u>Intimacy In Alcoholic Relationships: A Collection of Al-Anon Personal Stories</u>. I am so glad I finally read this book. The preface describes how complicated it can be for members to share about intimacy, which can include but is not limited to sexual intimacy.

The book is divided into six chapters covering: (1) alcoholism, (2) trust, (3) communication, (4) boundaries, (5) spirituality and (6) gratitude. Each chapter contains personal stories that inspire and comfort. Every chapter has questions at the end for the reader's self-reflection.

<u>Intimacy In Alcoholic Relationships</u> contains experience, strength and hope, no matter what forms intimacy take in your life.

In Chapter 5, a member shared about "the spiritual meaning of intimacy" and ended by saying:

The slogan "How Important Is It?" reminds me of what I value most in my relationship. The sweetness of sharing my innermost feelings and dreams is irreplaceable. That ability to share—that intimacy—is a blessing.

At the top of my list for those I have harmed are the intertwining of self and Higher Power, who I choose to call God. The lifelong relationship, within my heart, evolves when I practice being still, listening to silence and whoever is speaking to me. As one who is the queen of distraction, with moods that fluctuate with the wind, while judging situations, P.A.U.S.E. (Postponing Action Until Serenity Emerges) is vital for emotional stability.

"Jumping in can mean more trouble than waiting for God to show you what to do next," says Bridie P, an Al-Anon member for over 50 years.

In this moment, I am willing to make amends with HP and me. To be *willing* is an attitude of the mind and does not depend on outward conditions. Going inward can be challenging, after decades of seeking peace from other human beings, activities, and books. Writing, meditation, and whispering the Serenity prayer are tools to go inside the soul.

Amends means taking action to right the wrong we have done. In order to strive for balance, I will state: how I was wrong, how it makes God/me feel, and explain how to correct my distractions, moods, or judgments in the future. The reason for making this amends is to strengthen my relationship with God and to become closer with those who are important. By improving the power within, my external physical/emotional well being will be healthier, and hopefully, deeper connections will abide.

### This Month's Step, Tradition, and Concept

- **Step 8** Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- **Tradition 8** Al-Anon Twelfth Step work should remain forever non-professional, but our service centers may employ special workers.
- **Concept 8** The Board of Trustees delegates full authority for routine management of Al-Anon Headquarters to its executive committees.
